The past 18 months has been one of growth and achievement for netball in the Northern Territory. We started and ended the term with a strong and committed Board, ably supported by a talented and hardworking team in the office.

Our journey started with the engagement of our current Executive Officer, Shelley Haynes, who has brought a tremendous energy to the organisation through her professionalism and past experience within a large member association. Gillian Lee also commenced her role as the NTIS coach at the beginning of 2015 and has brought a great amount of worth in the coach education area.



As we farewelled three valuable staff members, Nikki Symons, Stephanie Anderson and Karen Randell, we thank them for the dedication towards developing netball though the Territory. At the start of 2016 we welcomed three new Development Managers who bring a range of skills and knowledge to the roles.

The 17U's, 19U's and 21U's teams represented NT with pride and displayed excellent sportsmanship during their respective 2015 competitions. In 2016 the 17U and 19U teams competed in the National competition in Perth against the other States and Territory. For the first time in 10 years the 17U's had a win at Nationals and finished in 7th place – the highest finishing position since 2000. Thank you to the coaches, managers and physios for their time, effort and commitment towards the athletes.

Our Territory Storm represented NT in the ANL competition in 2015. While they didn't record a win on the score board they certainly gained many personal wins and showed great enthusiasm and commitment towards the team. The Board made a hard decision to not enter a team in 2016 but rather focus on developing our underage talent and return to the competition in 2017.

The annual NT Championships was held in Alice Spring over the weekend of 19-21 September 2015. Each of the Member Associations was represented in one or more of the divisions and it was a delight to watch the emerging talent among the NT.

Thank you to the officials from each Member Association for given their time to develop these players and support them over the weekend. A sincere thank you to Tony Smith, NT Link for his continued support of this annual event.

Executive Officer's Report

SHELLEY HAYNES

2015 was certainly a year mixed with both challenges and achievements. Since commencing in the Executive Officer role in January 2015, the initial main goal was to consult with all of our stakeholders; listening to their feedback on where Netball NT could improve and what was required to re-establish the organisation as a respected entity in the sporting community.

It is still work in progress, however I believe Netball NT is beginning to show some creativity and represent their members with more purpose and in line with our objectives and strategies.

GOVERNANCE & STRATEGIC PLANNING

The Strategic Plan for 2011-2015 was reaching its final stages and work began on finalising the 2016-2020 Strategic Plan throughout the 2015 year. It was important to ensure that the plan linked in with Netball Australia's strategies and the staff have spent considerable time going through the plan with a view to setting up an Operational Plan, which underpins our Strategic Plan.

We are pleased to be able to launch the new Strategic Plan for 2016-2020 at this year's AGM. Thank you to those who provided input and feedback, particularly the Associations and Board members; and also to Consultant, Gail Humble for her tireless work on the finishing touches.

The Constitution was considered non-compliant at the end of 2014 and the Department of Business had highlighted six areas that required change. With the assistance of Board members, Trish Crossin, Melissa Yates and Catherine Norton, the Constitution was brought up to compliance level and accepted at a Special General Meeting of the Member Associations on the 20th September 2015.

GOVERNMENT SUPPORT

Netball NT is considered a Tier 1 Peak Sporting Body in the eyes of the Department of Sport & Recreation (DSR), as we meet several key objectives.

We are currently in the 3rd year of a 3-year cycle and are in the process of negotiating our funding for the next 3 years. We are required to satisfy the following requirements in order to continue to receive PSB funding each year:

• Participation: 1500+ members

• High Performance: NTIS program in place

• Inclusiveness: Programs in place for a diverse population including remote communities



- Athlete, Coach and Official development: Staff dedicated in these areas
- Staff resources: Full time EO, with a minimum of two other full-time staff
- Governance structure: Board has a staggered rotation and succession plan in place and clear separation between Board and staff
- Constitution: Has been reviewed in the last three years and is considered best practice
- Strategic Plan: The current plan is aligned to the National Sporting Organisation
- Operational Plan: A plan is reviewed and reported against the Strategic Plan
- Social Media: Website is up to date, live and interactive, including Social Media
- Financial: All reports are up to date and audited
- Total Revenue: \$500,000+
- Facilities: Own and/or manage own facility and capacity to meet operational costs
- Events: Capacity to conduct high-level events through local partnerships

In early 2015, we were given a rating by DSR of 4/10 for the above objectives and we are now sitting on a 10/10 rating. This places us in a strong position to continue to receive their support.

We thank the NT Government for their ongoing financial commitment and appreciate that without their funding, it would not be possible to deliver our current programs as effectively as we do.

FINANCIAL

All financial records are now up to date and audited. Our obligations to the Australian Taxation Office are now satisfied and the previous debt owing of approximately \$80,000 has been paid in full.

The 2014 Financial Year and 2015 Financial Year reports were presented and accepted at a Special General Meeting of the Member Associations on the 28th November 2015.

Under the new Constitution accepted in September 2015, the financial reporting year changed to Calendar year in order to capture the netball year and in line with Netball Australia. The reports presented at this year's AGM represent a 6-month period of 1^{st} July $2015 - 31^{st}$ December 2015 and are fully audited.

Netball NT is still recovering from a difficult period financially and the Board has accepted a deficit budget for the 2016 Calendar year, with a view to break even in the 2017 year. New systems and strategies have been implemented to ensure there is more-controlled expenditure and we are also continually exploring more diverse revenue streams.


MEMBER ASSOCIATIONS

Congratulations to the Alice Springs Netball Association on the \$5m funding of a 4-court indoor netball facility at the Pat Gallagher Centre. This is certainly exciting for the netball community in Alice, with the aim to have the facility completed by October for the Australian Masters Games.

Our staff will continue to improve the way we support our Member Associations and are particularly keen to hear from your committees on how we can achieve this.







NETBALL AUSTRALIA

We are thankful to our National Sporting Organisation, Netball Australia who provide us with financial support and leadership. The bar is certainly set high when it comes to expectations from the Member Organisations and we are continually looking at ways to improve our KPI's to ensure that we continuing to grow and develop in all areas.

The Netball World Cup was a culmination of years of planning by Netball Australia and they could not have asked for a better outcome with the Australian Diamonds taking out the gold medal! It was an extremely successful event, not only on the court, but off court in the commercial area and broadcast numbers.

NETBALL NT AMBASSADOR

Early in 2016, we were excited to announce that former NT representative player and Melbourne Vixens athlete, Karyn Bailey as our new Netball NT Ambassador. Karyn's netball journey began in Alice Springs as a junior, and then moved to Darwin to take up an NTIS scholarship. She represented NT in the 15U, 17U, 19U and 21U age groups. As an 18 year old she moved to Brisbane to play for the Queensland Firebirds, then the AIS and the Newcastle Jaegers in the Commonwealth Bank Trophy.



She moved to Victoria in her early 20's, representing the Victorian Fury in the ANL for 3 years. In 2012 she was picked up by the Melbourne Vixens and her ANZ Championship journey so far has been very successful. This lead to being selected in the Australian Diamonds Squad and representing Australia in the FAST5 World Series.

Most importantly, she still calls NT her home. In her role as the Netball NT ambassador she will conduct junior netball clinics, provide advice and support to our representative teams and make herself available as a guest speaker.

Karyn made her first visit to Darwin in March 2016 when she conducted junior clinics at both Palmerston and Darwin, as well as a specialist training session with the 17U and 19U athletes. There are planned visits to Alice Springs later in the year and Gove and Katherine early in 2017.



SPONSORS / COMMERCIAL

We have a strong commitment from sponsors, both local and interstate who continue to show their support of Netball NT. These include:

NT Link P/L: Sponsor of NT Championships, general sponsorship and provision of Netball NT work vehicle. Thank you to Company Director, Tony Smith for his ongoing support.

Sitzler P/L: Naming rights Sponsor the netball facility at Marrara, known as the "Sitzler Netball Centre". Thank you to Company Director, Michael Sitzler for his ongoing support.

100% Netball: Netball apparel supplier, who has been on board for three years and official uniform supplier to our representative teams, in addition to providing cash sponsorship. The 3-year contract will expire in October 2016 and the contract will be put out to tender in August this year.

Fresh Flowers & Gifts: Signage sponsor at Marrara, who is on a 2-year contract providing cash sponsorship. Thank you to Luke Scully for his ongoing support.

We continue to explore other commercial opportunities, including the leasing of office space and conducting programs and competitions which generate diverse income streams.



STAFFING STRUCTURE

The staffing structure has been modified for the 2016 year, with the Alice Springs position being made part-time and the Coaching and Umpiring portfolios being joined.

The three Development Managers which were in place at the beginning of the 2015 year, have now moved on into different areas. We thank Karen Randell for her work in establishing the NetSetGo program in the schools in Alice Springs, who has now moved on to work with Qantas in Customer Service. Stephanie Anderson moved back to her home state of Victoria in December 2015 and is now working at Netball Australia in the Community Engagement area. Nikki Symons completed her teaching degree and accepted a position with a local secondary school in February 2016.

On 16th March, it was the first time a One Netball Ambassador was able to participate in the Netball NT Strategic Planning day and collaborate together on an Action Plan for the year ahead. As it was also Harmony Day, it was an even more significant time to address the Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). A working group, including myself, was established, to develop a document as a secondary layer to the strategic plan. This document will identify the target areas in the RAP, which will be included in the strategic direction for this year.

One Netball followed up on a visit last year, to Tennant Creek, in which there was a tour of the local recreation facility and a brief discussion of advancing the game of netball in the area in terms of providing development opportunities and competitions. I will support the Community Development Managers in Darwin and Alice Springs, in a visit to Tennant Creek to initiate a fun day of competition including local teams and visiting teams from Katherine, Alice Springs and if possible some remote communities able to travel. The overall aim would be to assist Tennant Creek in establishing a sustainable model for participation in Netball for all age groups and abilities.

On the 19th May Katherine School of the Air, Katherine High School staff and students, myself in the One Netball Ambassador role, and the Community Development Manager Netball NT, will be hosting a day of netball drills and ball handling activities for remote school students. It is a fun day to promote team sport and netball for students who have limited access due to their location. It is also the opportunity to encourage some cross-cultural learning.

In the last two weeks of December, I will have the opportunity to liaise with the Community Development Manager to implement some netball skills sessions under the Sporting Schools program in conjunction with the Katherine School of the Air, annual Swim school event.



ONE NETBALL AMBASSADOR REPORT

It is anticipated that I will travel with the Community Development Manager on a re-visit to the Tiwi Islands (Milikapaiti) as was initiated last year, and a regional remote school via Katherine, as the dry season settles in and makes for better travel.

I would also like to attend NT Link this year and be available to support Netball NT and associations with any relevant duties but above all to promote One Netball.

There is still much to be done in the way of promoting One Netball throughout the NT and how it can support associations with ensuring their competitions provide equal opportunity for all players and support participation with respect for diversity.
