Child Safe Organisation Statement

Netball NT (NNT) is committed to creating and maintaining a child safe, child friendly organisation, in accordance with the [National Principles for Child Safe Organisations](#) and in addition to adopting [Netball Australia's Child Safeguarding Policy](#).

Job Description

Reporting to the Participation Officer, the Community Netball Coach will provide quality introductory netball programs for school-aged students in the Northern Territory. These programs will emphasise skill development and active participation in a safe and enjoyable environment.

Primarily, the position will implement the Netball NT school-based programs such as Sporting Schools and Woolworths NetSetGO to provide opportunities for every young person to participate and engage in the sport of netball.

The Community Netball Coach will be providing many children with their first netball experience in Primary Schools. Those Community Coaches that have more extensive experience or qualifications in coaching netball will also have opportunity to coordinate netball programs for High Schools students.

Clinic opportunities could be as simple as a 1-hour program or as large as a school requiring multiple sessions on a day throughout a term.

This position would be ideal for any students studying, part-time workers or stay-at-home parents.

Desired Skills and Experience

- Background and general knowledge of the game of netball
- Previous coaching experience at any level (confident to run a clinic with 20-30 students)
- Access to vehicle and valid NT Opens driver's license
- Capacity to travel remotely within the NT

Core Responsibilities

- Promote the purpose, values and behaviours of Netball NT within the greater Northern Territory advocating Netball as a deliverer in service excellence;
- Conduct school-based programs and/or development activities throughout Darwin and/or regional Northern Territory to increase awareness, participation and engagement in our sport;
- Implement high quality netball development programs and create a positive experience for junior participants;



- Attend NNT Induction and upskilling as required;
- Promote and support Netball NT aims and objectives of junior development across the Northern Territory;
- Maintain records and submit information in accordance with Netball NT requirements;
- Maintain regular correspondence with the Netball NT Participation Officer in reference to availability and program implementation;
- Complete all Community Coach pre-requisites e.g. Working With Children's Check

Essential Criteria

- Completion of the 'Getting to Know NetSetGO' module;
- Minimum Current Foundation Coaching Accreditation (or be willing to attain);
- High interpersonal, group management and organisational skills;
- Ability to work during and/or after school hours;
- Knowledge of the skills and rules of netball;
- Be currently affiliated with a netball club or Netball NT (or be willing to become affiliated);
- Ability to work independently and part of a broader team;
- Working with Children Check;
- A current valid driver's license and vehicle;
- At all times ensure a Child Safe environment;
- Comply with the [Netball Australia Member Protection Policy](#) and [Child Safeguarding Policy](#)

Key Interactions

- Ability to work with people across all levels of the sport including:
 - Netball NT staff
 - Association representatives
 - School personnel
 - Participants of our sport including children

Hours of work

The role is a casual position. Due to the nature of this position, most work will be conducted during and/or after school hours and/or during school holidays.

How to Apply

In line with the National Child Safeguarding Policy, NNT is required to interview all applicants. The applicants are also required to provide the names of two referees who will be contacted by NNT as a component of the final selection process. The referees can't be related to the applicant and must have known the applicant for a minimum of 12 months (one year). The applicant must provide the two referees on the Community Coach Application Form.



Applicants must submit a resume detailing their relevant experience and a cover letter outlining their ability to meet the Essential Criteria via the Community Coach Application form.
