Primary Objectives	The Assistant Coach shall support the Head Coach to deliver a program which aims to develop individual athletes and teams to take on the challenge of preparing and performing on the national stage, striving towards success both on and off the court.

Position Location	The Assistant Coach must be located within the NT.
Salary, Tenure and Program Commitment	<p>The NNT 17U & 19U NNC Head Coach positions are volunteer positions and will be appointed for a period of six (6) months. The program will commence in November 2024 and end in April 2025. An honorarium will be provided in May 2025 upon completion of all the Assistant Coach duties.</p> <p>The working hours will vary depending on the program schedule. It is anticipated that most working hours will be out of hours and may include early morning, late afternoon, and/or weekend sessions. Interstate travel for National Championships and training camps will also be required.</p>

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Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Liaise with the Head Coach & NNT Pathway Manager to establish specific responsibilities for the role including, but not limited to deliver training sessions, feedback during training/matches, athlete wellbeing, etc • Attend and assist the Head Coach for the following events: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Selections (Phase 1 Darwin: 15-17 Nov 24, Phase 1 Alice Springs: 22-24 Nov 24, Phase 2 7-9 Feb 25) ○ Training sessions in their region/city ○ Training camps (TBC mid-late Mar 2025) ○ National Netball Championships (April 2025)
Athlete Management System (AMS)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Assistant Coach may be required, in conjunction with the Head Coach, to use the AMS system throughout the program
Trainings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consult with the Head Coach around specific responsibilities • Assist the Head Coach at all team meetings, training sessions and team functions • Assist with coaching all 17U and 19U athletes in the region • Minimum 2-3 training sessions per week: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Darwin – Wednesday evenings, Sunday mornings, possible third session TBC per group feedback ○ Alice Springs – Wednesday evenings, Sunday mornings, possible third session TBC per group feedback
Competition & Training Camps	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consult with the Head Coach re: responsibilities during competition and training camps • This may include, but not limited to, athlete wellbeing, game warm up, match statistics, video review, feedback during matches, athlete organisation, team building activities
Communications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Participate in and contribute to the program review process during both preparation and competition phases • Liaise with NNT Pathway Manager re: player development in accordance with Netball NT policies and procedures and the 'Australian Way' of netball • Team officials and/or NNT planning and review meetings • Complete Assistant Coach post Nationals report
